How the Long Table came to be

Don Hancey - Chef and WA Food Ambassador

I remember clearly my darling mum Connie Hancey saying to me that on my next home visit to Bunbury I needed to talk with Leonie Kershaw and Snookie Manea about an idea they had for a Chefs Charity Lunch to raise funds to save the historic old Bunbury Jetty.

Anyone growing up or living in Bunbury in the 1900's would remember this amazing timber jetty, built in 1864 by convicts. The waters underneath the jetty a fisherman's paradise supplying crabs and fish tor recreational fishers whilst still operating as an active port. As a kid growing up in Bunbury the jetty was a place of fun and excitement where you could dangle a crab net off the side and catch a blue manna crab, hook a herring or 2 and simply have an adventure outdoors.

After meeting with Leonie and Snookie the plan was hatched to create a Long Table Lunch on the walkway from the rail bridge to where the new Dome building stands.

The first Long Table we sold around 100 tickets and raised about \$6000. From that first Long Table in 2004 the CLTCL has morphed into one of Australia's longest running regional Charity Lunches. The focus on where the funds raised were to be directed changed from trying to save the Bunbury Jetty to assisting local families and community organisations in need.

In volunteering for this event the hospitality industry could give back to the people who support them thus heralding the birth of the Chefs Long Table Charity Lunch. Many of the business, volunteers and chefs have been with the charity event from its inception and still hold the passion and dedication along with old and new committee members, chefs and businesses to ensure its continued and ongoing success.

Leonie has been the driver and inspiration for the CLTCL and I take my hat off to her and salute her absolute generosity of spirit. Leonie's daughter Tanya for over a decade ran the back of house kitchen, the engine room of the event, a formidable demanding task given the volume of quality food being served by the equally professional service from the front of house and beverage staff. All of these donate their time, knowledge, expertise, produce and more to ensure the success of this iconic charity event.

What continues to excite me is at the end of the lunch you realise you have been an ingredient in recipe that is way greater than yourself, a whole bunch of generous spirited people, a lunch that is 100% volunteer charged from the planning and set up crew, the dishwashers, the chefs, the front of house, the committee, the ongoing generous sponsors and you folk, the people who buy the tickets. To me it's the true essence of collective giving.

Busselton Senior Citizen Centre Inc | Kitchen upgrade



The Busselton Senior Citizens Centre (BSCC) opened in 1980 and was established to provide seniors within the community with an area to meet and participate in fun, interesting and engaging activities. The Centre is a membership based organisation and accepts anyone over the age of 55 years. For a small fee, members are able to participate in a variety of social activities including indoor bowls, table tennis, gentle gym, gentle gym, gym with weights, yoga, Zumba, yogalates, scrabble, bridge, euchre, canasta and Bingo.Visitors are also most welcome but they pay slightly higher participation fees.

The Centre is not-for-profit aiming to have a positive impact on both local seniors and the entire community. Members join the Centre to meet new friends, keep fit, socialize and improve cognitive skills.

We also have our very own Restaurant, it is open 5 days a week Monday – Friday and provides lunch to Members, Visitors and also Meals on Wheels to the Community. Three paid Staff and 4 Volunteers per day work as a team to deliver this service.

An average of 100 hot, freshly cooked meals are prepared daily and delivered by Volunteers to Meals on Wheels clients and 30 – 40 of the Centre's members, pensioners in the main, also regularly avail themselves of these nutritious, lowcost, meals which are served at the Centre. Visiting Seniors are also welcome to purchase the meals and enjoy the camaraderie.

The Centre kitchen has not been upgraded since inception and is in dire need of upgrading. Funds will be applied to replace outdated, inefficient and failing equipment, with the Centre providing near-matching funding.

Bunbury City Band



Bunbury City Band provides free entertainment at various community events throughout the South West, including Australia Day ceremonies, ANZAC Day, Rotary Kids Fair Day, Grandparents and Carers Day, Dunstan Street Christmas Lights, Remembrance Day and many other RSL-related events. They also regularly delight residents at many local Nursing Homes with their band music

The Bunbury City Band will apply its Beneficiary funding to the purchase of new music folders for the 10 years + Junior members to expand their repertoire. They plan to encourage more young people to learn a musical instrument and join the group.

The Club will also purchase new music stands for the 60 or so Senior brass band members.

2023 Beneficiaries

PCYC | Youth Fair



Bunbury PCYC will conduct a Youth Fair at its Parade Road facilities as a learning experience for young people aged 12-18 focused on developing business skills and team work and giving these young people the opportunity to work together to plan and stage a one-day fun, family activity for the community.

PCYC youth workers and staff will assist up to 60 participants of the Centre's safeSPACE program to develop individual plans for creating and producing goods for sale initially at a Youth Fair. Participants are at risk young people and come from a range of backgrounds including Aboriginal and Torres Straight Island, Police Priority Offenders and Culturally and Linguistically Diverse.

Funds have been allocated to safeSPACE participants to purchase supplies and materials to make their own unique saleable goods or provide a service such as cupcakes, bracelets, photography, tie dye clothing, hair accessories, hair braiding, face painting, phone covers, jewellery etc. In addition to creating saleable items, members will learn valuable life skills, communication skills, cash handling, teamwork and strategic thinking, increasing their confidence and sense of community connection and support.

Seniors Recreation Council of WA Bunbury Branch



SRCWA Bunbury Branch encourages older adults to become involved in healthy ageing activities through attending an Information and Activity Day which incorporates a range of static displays offering senior-specific information, demonstrations, workshops and interactive activities. Led by local clubs and social organisations, the activities focus on the principles of Act – Belong - Commit which encourages people to be physically active, to broaden their social involvement and to seek information and explore volunteering opportunities.

The Aged Care Games, a day of gentle, fun activities is designed for those living in 'care' situations. The Games are chosen to encourage participation in light competition and social interaction.

Beneficiary funding has been provided for the purchase of promotional materials - Pull up Banners, Display Banners and a Promotional Table cloth with Logo to be used to promote the two free special activity days for over 45-year-olds

2023 Beneficiaries

Morrissey Homestead | Respite House



Morrissey Leschenault Respite House, located in Australind, is a secure building with 4 bedrooms specially designed to accommodate the needs of Aged Care clients, people with dementia and people with disabilities. The complex is designed to simulate home settings and freedom of movement throughout the building and the grounds is encouraged.

Morrissey also offers a valuable service to support Carers of people with Disabilities and Carers of older people by providing them with ready access to short-term breaks from their caring role or emergency respite.

Beneficiary funds will be applied to the purchase of specialised 'hospital' beds which allow adjustment for body positioning and height, mattresses, slide sheets, bed linen and recliner chairs.

Services are primarily available to people who reside in the Greater Bunbury area however people living outside this immediate area are also eligible to take advantage of the Respite House services.


